Giving from the Heart — The Ella Fitzgerald Charitable Foundation

eading aloud to young children is thought to be the number one intervention in developing their literacy skills. The latest research reminds us that reading aloud to a child early in life stimulates brain activity, promotes the ability to learn to read, and helps children start school ready to learn and succeed.

The Ella Fitzgerald Charitable Foundation began partnering with Connections For Children (CFC) several years ago, when Executive Director, Fran Morris Rosman learned of our mission and commitment to early childhood education and early literacy. The Foundation supports CFC through its "A Book Just For Me" Program. Thanks to the Foundation and Fran Morris Rosman, CFC has brand new books in the Resource Library to share with families and Child Care providers. During the holidays, children participating in the CFC child care assistance programs receive age-appropriate books - in some cases these are the first new books they have ever owned. CFC staff members read the books to children during CFC's "Fun Visits" to child care sites, and in turn leave the books for the providers to help supplement programming and for the children to take home and share with their families. When asked why The Ella Fitzgerald Charitable Foundation supports Connections For Children, Fran said, "Connections For Children encompasses Ella's desire to share the world with kids by inspiring them towards a love of reading."

The Ella Fitzgerald Charitable Foundation was created and funded in 1993 by Ms. Ella Fitzgerald, the beloved "First Lady of Song," in order to fulfill her desire to use the fruits of her success to help people of all races, cultures



Recognizing Board Member Betsy Hiteshew

hen recently asked to participate in the Santa Monica Bay Area Human Relations Council's annual recognition program, "Community Heroes: Ordinary People Who Do Extraordinary Things", it was our pleasure and good fortune to nominate Ms. Betsy Hiteshew, a Connections For Children Board Member, as a 2011 Community Hero.

The primary goal of the Community Heroes Program is to recognize individuals whose involvement with community-based non-profit organizations contributes to building a respectful, inclusive, community. Community Heroes promote understanding within the diverse community of Santa Monica; they make a difference in the community

and are able to demonstrate compassion for others. It was these qualifications that prompted our nomination of Betsy.

Betsy has always been a visionary leader and pioneer in the early child care and education movement. During the mid 1970's, as women began to reenter the workforce in greater numbers, there was a growing

need for child care services. In response, a few child care resource and referral agencies sprang up in San Francisco and in Pasadena. Betsy, who was the Director of Early Childhood Education at Santa Monica College at the time, along with several other forward-thinking women, identified the need for a similar program to support families in the Santa Monica and surrounding areas. Together, these pioneering women founded the Child Care Information Service, which a few years later was renamed Connections For Children.

Today Betsy remains a tireless advocate for the care and early educational needs of children in Santa Monica and surrounding areas. She is a champion for all children, working to ensure they have the benefit of the high quality early care and education experiences that can make such a difference in their social, emotional, language, and cognitive development as well as their success in school and in life! Not only has Betsy been nominated as a "Community Hero," but she is and will always be a "Hero" to all of us at Connections For Children. Congratulations, Betsy!
